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ACTIVITIES FOR SCHOOL LEAVERS

As years 11s and 13s prepare to leave school, pupils are strongly encouraged to maximise opportunities that develop their future goals and dreams. We've highlighted some of the many virtual activities happening during the rest of the term to help keep them energised and excited about their potential plans.

<u>That Interview Experience</u> is a series of podcasts created by Ash Taylor (a Buckinghamshire Enterprise Adviser) for school leavers, where he interviews business leaders about interview expectations, what's required from a CV and all things relating to overcoming that first interview experience.

<u>Your Internship Experience UK</u> for over 18s is starting on 28 June. It's an immersive, virtual experience which will help build connections with employers and introduce you to industry experts to understand what really makes you successful in a particular sector.

STEM Clubs Week 2021 from STEM Learning will take place on 21 – 25

June, with a theme of Sport and Exercise. Designed for all year groups, it has an exciting timetable of virtual sessions created to inspire young people, including talks, fun challenges and webinars. The sessions will be streamed live on YouTube that week and the schedule will be announced soon on their website.


