'Based on current evidence and the mitigating measures that FE providers are putting in place, face coverings will not generally be necessary in the traditional classroom setting, even where social distancing is not possible. There is greater use of controls for minimising risk, including in keeping in small consistent groups, and greater scope for physical distancing by staff within classrooms.
